How to join us:

A navigation page will be set up on the Gauge O Guild website www.gaugeoguild.com via which you enter the show. After the welcome page, you will find various 'zones' to choose from:

- Layouts
- Demonstrations
- Traders adverts & promotions
- The Technical Committee sessions and Modelling Competition
- A timetable of 'Live' announcements.

You can pick and choose where you go and what you look at. When you have finished in one area you can return to the home page and choose another area.

After reviewing the timetable of live events – choose which one(s) you wish to join and click on the link at the allotted time. Joining these sessions will be intuitive - you just follow the instructions on the screen.

There will be a live help desk running all day manned by volunteers from the Events Team so if you have questions or cannot find something, please click on the 'Help Team' link.

This area will include 15 layouts with descriptions, photographs and links to prerecorded videos. Some of the layouts featured are static. They are permanently situated at someone's house, shed or in their garden so you won't have seen them at exhibitions before. Entry is open now and will close on 24 October 2020. Voting will be open until 4 pm at the Virtual Show.
